Covid-19 and the Christmas Holiday

Please be aware, as required by the government, we have been asked to continue to track and trace any possible Covid cases during the first few days of the Christmas holiday.

If your child develops symptoms and tests positive for Covid from the evening of Friday 18 December up to 4pm on Sunday 20 December, please email the school admin account at admin.churchfields-inf@redbridge.gov.uk as soon as possible and put POSITIVE COVID TEST in the title bar so we can identify your email quickly. (If symptoms appear after 4pm on Sunday, the track and trace will be done by the NHS.)

It is important to arrange a test for your child as soon as symptoms appear. Please DO NOT order a home test, but book an appointment at a local test centre as you will receive the results quickly – at present, tests are back within 24-48 hours.

We will need the following information:

- the date of the first symptom
- · the date of the <u>positive</u> test

This way we can trace and inform any known close contacts quickly and ensure the safety of us all once we break up. If your child has been in contact with a positive test case before the end of term, the school will inform you during the Christmas break and your child must self-isolate up to the date provided.
