We are amazed with learning that you are completing at home. We will shortly be sending you a copy of our remote learning plan, as directed by the DfE. I hope you find it useful to understand the rationale behind our plan and see how we are providing a balanced remote learning package as we know our families are all experiencing different scenarios at present. The plan contains lots of useful information you may need including accessing Google Classroom, year group expectations and also top tips about supporting your little one(s) to learn from home.

Miss Roult hosted our first Google Meet family support session for Year Two this week, which provided a fantastic opportunity for parents to ask questions concerning our home learning, for example; how we teach particular mathematical concepts, or asking advice on encouraging their child/children to be more independent in their learning. We will be developing this with other year groups during the next week or two, so please join us if there is something you would like to know more about. Mrs Lannin has produced a helpful video on how we teach writing in the early years and we will also develop this kind of support in the next few weeks. We hope the videos and Google Meet sessions will, in some way, replace the content of our successful Family Workshops that usually take place during the spring term – sorry we can't provide the tea and biscuits this time!

Our team continue to work both in school, with our vulnerable pupils and children of key workers who cannot work from home, and also remotely organising learning for you all at home. 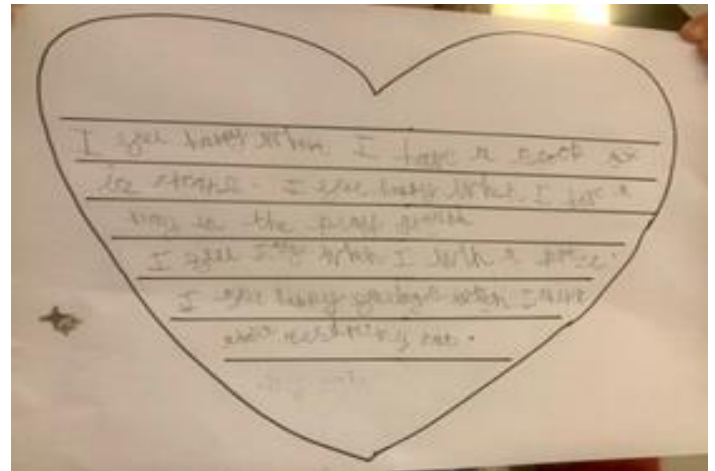
