School Uniform

As you know, our children are proud to wear our school uniform as part of our school community. We understand that it has been difficult to buy new items of uniform recently and we have been flexible in our approach.

After Easter, the expectation is that all children wear full uniform as follows:

- · a white blouse or polo shirt
- · grey skirt, shorts, pinafore or trousers
- navy cardigan, jumper or sweatshirt with or without logo
- \cdot white or grey socks or tights no visible leggings please
- · sensible, plain black shoes no boots please
- · blue & white checked summer dress during the summer months
- \cdot a suitable coat

PE Uniform (to be worn on PE days as advised by your child's class teacher)

- · trainers
- · navy shorts or navy joggers
- $\cdot\,$ a white T shirt with or without logo
- \cdot a navy fleece in colder weather

Nursery Uniform

- \cdot a white polo shirt
- · navy blue joggers or shorts
- \cdot navy cardigan, jumper or sweatshirt with or without logo
- · black Velcro fastening shoes no boots please
- $\cdot\,$ blue &white checked dress in the summer months worn with socks, not tights
- \cdot a suitable coat

For <u>health and safety</u> reasons, no jewellery is to be worn in school. This includes any earrings for pierced ears.

Please name all articles of clothing, including plimsolls, clearly.

Thank you to the PTA for supplying each child with an Easter Egg.


We had lots of fun with our 'Covidsafe' Easter Egg Hunt and the children enjoyed a visit from the Easter Bunny.

Parent App provides a simple way to collect, manage and handle your information, and view school term and inset dates. More importantly, when your child is involved in an activity, event or trip, we are able to ensure the latest information is taken with us. Activating your SIMS Parent account is quick and easy, and a letter will be sent out giving you all the relevant details once children return to school after the Easter break.
