Rising Covid-19 Cases

Firstly, thank you all for your support and patience during the last couple of weeks. Like other local schools, we have many pupils and staff required to isolate as we continue to follow current government guidance regarding isolation for close contacts. Sadly, we have had to close a bubble this week.

We now know that the government have announced that they are scrapping isolation for bubbles or close contacts with positive cases. Please be aware that this new guidance is not in place yet and we must continue to follow current procedures. We hope to keep as many children in school as we can.

We are experiencing an increase in children with Covid-19 symptoms and have been required to send a number of children home. As a reminder:

- Please do not send your child/ren in if they are displaying Covid-19 symptoms. They must isolate and take a PCR test, not an LFD test.
- If you or a family member display any symptoms, please do not send your child/ren into school.
- If you or a family member tests positive for Covid, then your child/ren must isolate for 10 days.

We are desperately trying to keep all bubbles open until the end of term.

Covid-19 Government Guidance

I have now received the guidance from the government which outlines how the current restrictions can be removed, including bubbles and staggered starts, from Monday 19th July. As you will appreciate, it will be a lot of change for our young children, especially drop off and collection arrangements, for the last three days of term. We will keep most of our safety measures in place until the end of term and, if all continues to be well, look forward to implementing new arrangements from September.

I know that from Monday 19th July there is no need to wear face coverings, but I ask you to be respectful of our staff team and to wear a face covering if you need to directly speak to them. I am sure you will understand that after the challenging year we have all experienced, we do not wish to develop symptoms during the first few days of the holiday. I thank you for your understanding and know many of you are anxious too.

Meeting New Teachers

Most of our Y2 children have now visited the juniors to explore their new school and meet their teacher. They really enjoyed their visit and are ready for the next stage of their learning journey. If they missed the opportunity due to isolation, we will try to organise another time before the end of year.

On Friday 16th July, children in Y1 and YR will have the opportunity to meet their new teachers. We have planned to host these meetings outside so that we can maintain distancing and not create any additional risk of closing bubbles.

Teachers will be available in the playgrounds so that you will be able to say a quick hello. Please note that it will not be possible to have a long conversation as we need to keep the meeting as brief as possible. Please be assured that teachers have been meeting as part of our transition process and your child's new teacher will be fully aware of their needs. We will be writing to you with more details shortly.

Last year our 'Meet the Team' videos were popular with our families so we will be repeating this again. During the last few days of term you will receive a video introducing your child's teacher and team. You will be able to view the recording during the holiday to ease the transition to the next year group.
