Next Year

Government guidance has now changed and we expect that our routines will return to normal in September. I will write to you separately to give you further details nearer the time, but here are the main points so that you can prepare for September:

- We will not use the one-way system at pick up and collection times. For children in Reception, Year One and Year Two, they may enter the playground and wait with parents and carers for the bell at 8:55am. Children will then line up and enter the building with a member of staff. Please do not worry – we will give further details and there will be lots of extra staff to support on the first day. The nursery day will begin at 8:45am.
- The school day will finish at 3:30pm for infants. We will open the gates at 3:25pm and you may collect children from the classroom door. Again, there will be lots of support in September for the first few days. Nursery will finish at 3:45pm.
- When we return in September, and if it is safe to do so, we will introduce after school clubs, followed by a breakfast club. More details will follow in September.
- We will operate under normal guidance with a contingency plan that can be put in place if our community has high numbers of Covid-19 cases, or if advised to by the government or Local Authority.
