Please follow the instructions enclosed with the artwork for details on how to place orders with Arts Projects. All orders must be completed by **Friday 11 November**.



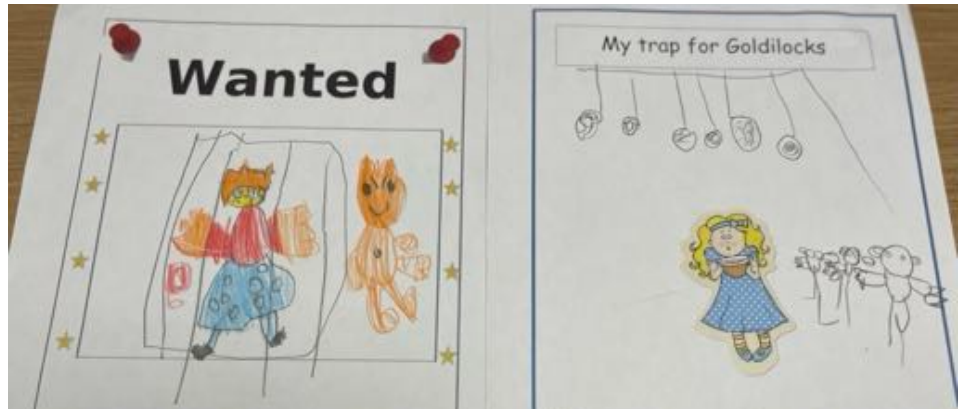
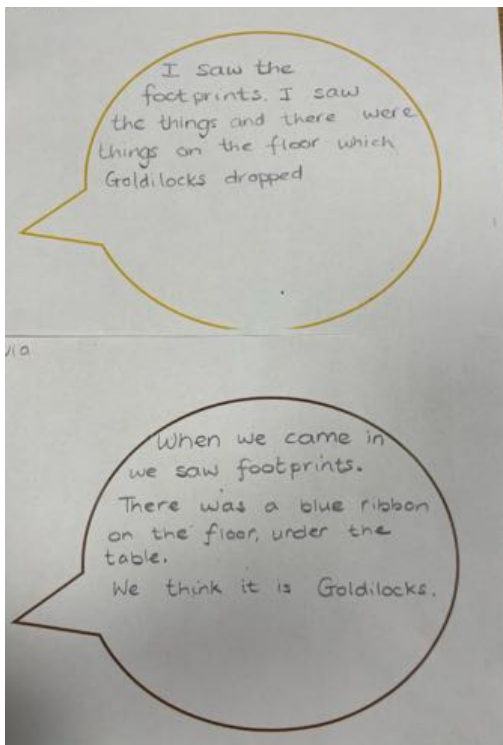
Reception's Mystery
