Monday - Multi-Sport and Lego.


Tuesday - Gymnastics, Film and Book.

September is here once again and we are lucky to have the wonderful weather to return to. We are entering into the second phase of planning our Outdoor Area, with a vision to create a biodiversity environment for our children to be part of and enjoy. We wish to support wildlife and habitats by introducing mini ponds, bug hotels and small wildflower areas. We shall receive a delivery of shrubs and trees from the Wildlife Trust in November which will need planting. After a dark winter, we all think of spring, so now is the time for us to start planting bulbs as autumn slowly arrives.

We have kindly received a small donation from Waitrose to help with purchasing plants but we are in need of any building material such as logs, palettes, stone and pebbles to help create these spaces. We would very much appreciate any donations from works you may have had done and materials that are no longer needed. Please ask family and friends.

Nut Policy

We would like to remind parents that our school has a strict 'No Nut Policy'. We have children in school who have **severe** (airborne) nut allergies.

We ask that you do not give your child any nut products (including chocolate spread) if they have a packed lunch and also ask children to refrain from eating snacks on our premises before and after school. We thank you for your support and understanding in this matter.



Mobile Phones

We would like to remind you not to use mobile phones on the school premises when dropping off or collecting children. There are many reasons for this: firstly, we have a duty to safeguard our children, and the use of mobile devices when children are present, both in our playgrounds and on our school site, is not permitted. Also, we believe that it is really important to talk to your child about their day and their achievements when they are collected from school and as our sign says:

'Greet your child with a smile, not a mobile!'.

E-Safety Tip of the Week!

With the excitement of a new school year and your child reaching a new milestone, many of us share photos of our child online without thinking about the associated risks. If you do choose to post online, then try following these basic rules:

- Don't post any photos of your child that show their school logo/name that can make it easy for people to find out their location
- Never include your child's full name
- Are there any other children in the pictures you share online? If yes, do you have permission from their parent/carer to upload it?
- Make sure appropriate privacy settings are on.

Alternatively, you could just share photos with those who you really want to share the photo with (grandparents etc.) via WhatsApp or iMessage rather than via social media.





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
