Writing In Year 2

Year Two have been using a text without words in their English lessons this half term; they have looked carefully at the pictures to decide what is happening in the story and have been developing their skills in making predictions about what they think might happen next from given points in the story!

This week they have used their predictions about what will happen to the main character next to write a simple story including a problem and a resolution - and with problems, the scarier the better! Children have used interesting sentence starters and have been challenged to begin adding description and 'tasty words' to their writing to make it more interesting for their reader. We hope you will agree that these examples show how well our Year Two children are writing already!

Art In Year 1

Year One have been working so hard in their Art lessons this week! They looked at some different pieces of Art by Bridget Riley and discussed and described the different types of lines they could see. Children then rehearsed making and drawing different types of lines, and demonstrated their skills in their sketch books.



School Admissions 2024

If your child is starting Reception, transferring from infant to junior school, or transferring from primary to secondary school in September 2024, you must apply online at <u>www.redbridge.gov.uk/schools/</u><u>schooladmissions/</u>.

Application rounds are now open and must be submitted by 15th January 2024.

E-Safety Tip of the Week!

Safe Searching

There is so much online that we would not want our child to view and even an innocent search can result in inappropriate content being seen. To make our child's online world safer, we would firstly recommend switching on Safesearch settings for the search engine your child uses. However, as not all search engines allow you to 'lock' Safesearch on (so users may be able to simply turn it off), we would encourage you to apply further parental controls.

For some search engines, for example Google, you can set up a Family management account, which will ensure that Safesearch settings cannot be switched off. We would recommend using a family management account (either Google or Microsoft) so even if your child is using a search engine that cannot be locked, there will at least be an additional level of content filtering provided.

In addition to the above, make sure you have set up appropriate parental controls on your home broadband (and any consoles/ devices/ apps/ websites that your child uses/accesses) for example, to restrict access to explicit websites or access to websites that are not suitable for children.

Please remember that no filtering/ parental control is 100% safe, so it is important that you talk to your child about how they can stay safe online and that they should talk to you or another trusted adult if they need to.
