A gentle reminder that this is for **scooters only** to maximise the space. **Please do not leave bikes**. Scooters and bikes **must not** be left in the the junior school car park.




Nursery Tours

If your child is starting Reception, transferring from infant to junior school, or transferring from primary to secondary school in September 2024, you must apply online at www.redbridge.gov.uk/schools/schools/schooladmissions/. The deadline for parents and carers to apply for primary school places for children born between 01/09/2019 and 31/08/2020 is on **15th January 2024**. Please note that where parents are intending to request deferred entry for their summer-born children, they still need to apply by this deadline.

E-Safety Tip of the Week!

Setting Boundaries

It's never too early to start setting rules about when, and for how long, your child can use devices; you can start to introduce the subject of internet safety at the same time. Encourage children to use devices in a shared space like a lounge or kitchen. Make sure to keep other devices out of reach and use passwords so that children can't go online without asking you first. It's also a good idea to have tech-free mealtimes and not to allow children to have devices in their bedrooms at this age.
