

Going Home Books

As you will be aware, we use Little Wandle Letters and Sounds as our chosen systematic synthetic phonics programme in school. When we invested in this scheme and the accompanying resources, it required purchasing several new books, which could be sent home weekly with children. The PTA very kindly funded these books. Unfortunately, we have already had a number of books ruined/damaged.

Please can we take this opportunity to remind you not to put water bottles in bookbags, as they can leak and cause damage. We do understand that accidents happen, but please let your child's class teacher know in these instances so that a new copy can be ordered. We are now limited on the number of books that we have and therefore, we will be charging £5 for lost or damaged books from this point forward.

Online Safety Workshop

This week, we have sent a detailed letter about e-safety (to your Teachers2Parents accounts). Please do take a look if you haven't yet had an opportunity to do so. As part of this, we have provided information about an upcoming parent workshop. On **Friday 15th March, at 9:00am, we will be hosting an online safety workshop in the school hall**. This event is open for all parents and carers to attend. It is designed to cover a range of topics, such as age-ratings, parental controls and helping your child to develop healthy online habits in a rapidly advancing technological age. Afterwards, at **9:30am**, we will run a drop-in session **until 10.30am**. The aim of this is for you to come by and request support with devices, or to speak with us individually about any queries or concerns.

Absence And Illness

If your child is unwell, please call the school office or email on absence@churchfieldsinfants.redbridge.sch.uk on the first day of absence.

Please also ensure that the school office has your correct contact details so that you can be telephoned in the event of your child/ren being poorly within school.

Please be aware that if your child has experienced recent vomiting, diarrhoea, or has an active temperature, kindly wait 48-hours, after the last episode, before allowing them to return to school.

Appointments should be made outside of school hours wherever possible, and proof of these must be given if taken during the school day. The Term Time Absence Request forms need to be completed, and signed in advance by the Headteacher, for all other absences.
