## World Book Day And The Big Read

## Head Lice

Head lice are very common in young children and do not have anything to do with dirty hair. We ask that all parents/ carers check their child weekly.


Head lice are picked up by head-to-head contact. Itching and scratching on the scalp occurs 2 to 3 weeks after infection. There is no incubation period. Treatment is only needed if live lice are seen. Over the counter treatments can be used. Alternatively, lice can be physically removed by combing through hair (using a fine- toothed comb) that has been lubricated with conditioner. This needs to be repeated every 3 days to prevent new lice from maturing and laying more eggs.

## **Online Safety Workshop**

This week, we have sent a detailed letter about e-safety (to your Teachers2Parents accounts). Please do take a look if you haven't yet had an opportunity to do so. As part of this, we have provided information about an upcoming parent workshop. On **Friday 15<sup>th</sup> March, at 9:00am, we will be hosting an online safety workshop in the school hall**. This event is open for all parents and carers to attend. It is designed to cover a range of topics, such as age-ratings, parental controls and helping your child to develop healthy online habits in a rapidly advancing technological age. Afterwards, at **9:30am**, we will run a drop-in session **until 10.30am**. The aim of this is for you to come by and request support with devices, or to speak with us individually about any queries or concerns.




Please also ensure that the school office has your correct contact details so that you can be telephoned in the event of your child/ren being poorly within school.
