World Book Day And The Big Read

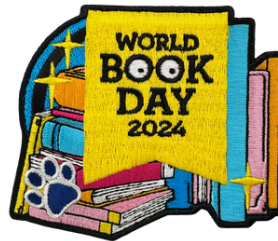
It's nearly World Book Day and we are busy planning a wonderful day of exciting activities. We will celebrate on **Friday 8th March**.
