












WOW Walk to School Badge Design

Parent Controls

Following a question last week (at the e-safety workshop) regarding parent controls and restrictions on phones and tablets, please see the below support:



iPhones and iPads

With Family Sharing, the organiser can set up parental controls and alerts to sensitive content for children in the Family Sharing group. You can use Screen Time to manage how your children use their Apple devices. You can also turn on Ask to Buy, so children must receive approval for eligible purchases and free downloads.

Galaxy Phones and Tablets

Parental controls with Google's Family Link app allow you to set rules for how a phone and tablet are used, allowing you to guide your child while they learn and play online. You can set up Parental controls as long as they're running One UI 2.0 or a later software version.
