#### Pink is for Everybody by Ella Russell



#### The Boy with Flowers in His Hair by Jarvis



## **End of Year Concerts**

We are so excited to be preparing to perform our end of year concerts, with a live audience inside our hall, for the first time since summer 2019! We understand that for most of you, this will be the first time you will have been invited into the hall to watch our concerts live so please read the following carefully to ensure the health and safety of all.

As we are a large school, we perform each concert twice to accommodate our 120 families in each year group and ask that the parents/carers from two classes attend on each day. Our school hall is fairly small so please try to attend on your assigned day and keep guests to two per family so we can fit everyone in comfortably.

Please also note that we do not allow siblings or other children to attend our concerts. We know that this may come as a surprise to some of you but this system worked well before the pandemic. Our children have worked very hard to perform for you and, with younger siblings in the audience, it is not always possible to hear our children speak or act. In the past, families have been supportive of this measure and have enjoyed giving their performing child their full attention. Please find suitable arrangements if you have other children. We will be hosting another Big Read very soon and would love to welcome your little ones into school then. We would like to thank you for your support in this matter.

For afternoon performances, we will open the pedestrian gate 15 minutes before each performance is due to begin so please do not feel the need to arrive before this time. For morning performances, we will open the year two gates **at 9:10** so that we can register the children safely before the concert begins.
