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## Scooter Safety

We are pleased that our scooter racks are being very well used and children are enjoying scooting to school. Please be reminded that children should not ride scooters on the school premises. The entrance to our school is very narrow for the large number of children and adults who use it and we have been informed that there have been a couple of near collisions on the way into school. Please ask your child to dismount to push their scooter to the racks where they can be stored for the day.

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## Head Lice

Head lice are very common in young children and do not have anything to do with dirty hair. We ask that all parents/ carers check their child weekly.

Head lice are picked up by head-to-head contact. Itching and scratching on the scalp occurs 2 to 3 weeks after infection. There is no incubation period. Treatment is only needed if live lice are seen. Over the counter treatments can be used. Alternatively, lice can be physically removed by combing through hair (using a fine-toothed comb) that has been lubricated with conditioner. This needs to be repeated every 3 days to prevent new lice from maturing and laying more eggs.
