### **Telephone Box Library**

Thank you, as always, for your generous donations to our lending library.

It is important to remember that books must be placed in the yellow, labelled box (outside the office), to ensure school staff can check the books before being placed in the library.

When donating books, please consider the age of our children. Although we have many fluent readers, we need to consider if the content is age appropriate.

We have had some donations of books that are for an older audience.



### **Mobile Phones**

We would like to remind you not to use mobile phones on the school premises when dropping off or collecting children. There are many reasons for this: firstly, we have a duty to safeguard our children, and the use of mobile devices when children are present, both in our playgrounds and on our school site, is not permitted. Also, we believe that it is really important to talk to your child about their day and their achievements when they are collected from school and as our sign says:



'Greet your child with a smile, not a mobile!'

### Head lice

Head lice are very common in young children and do not have anything to do with dirty hair. We ask that all parents/ carers check their child weekly.

Head lice are picked up by head-to-head contact. Itching and scratching on the scalp occurs 2 to 3 weeks after infection. There is no incubation period. Treatment is only needed if live lice are seen. Over the counter treatments can be used. Alternatively, lice can be physically removed by combing through hair (using a fine- toothed comb) that has been lubricated with conditioner. This needs to be repeated every 3 days to prevent new lice from maturing and laying more eggs.
