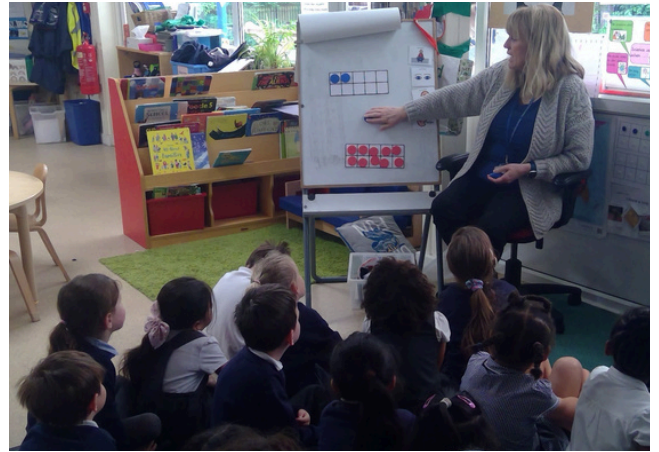
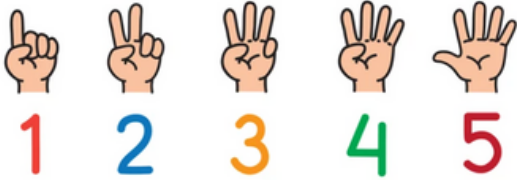
This will be on the same day as our summer fayre, Saturday 8th June.
