Can you share food items for a picnic, or another idea of choice, between you and the people at home? We would love to see your grouping and sharing work in action!

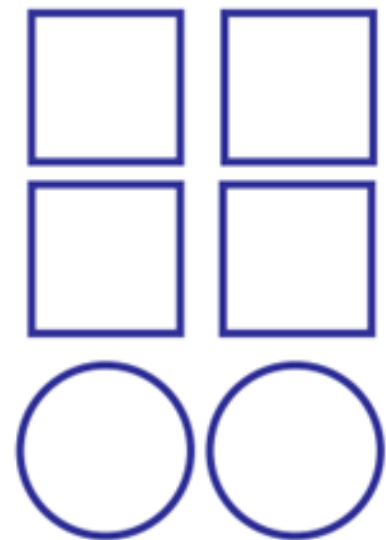
Years 1 and 2
